The Southern District of Florida (SDFL) has long been one of the busiest Federal trial courts in this country. Stretching over 300 miles, from Fort Pierce in the north to the nation's southernmost point in Key West, the Court's bench includes 18 authorized District Judge positions; 6 Senior District Judges; 16 Magistrate Judge positions; and 3 recalled Magistrate Judges in 2010. The Court convenes court in five divisions—Miami, Fort Lauderdale, West Palm Beach, Fort Pierce and Key West—and maintains full-time staff in each.

The Southern District's Judges are supported by over 160 full-time Clerk's Office employees and over 100 chambers staff. The duties of this dedicated work force involve a broad spectrum of service ranging from operational activities, including case processing and courtroom support, to administrative services such as budget and financial activities. Because the efficient functioning of a court this size requires a wide variety of professional support, a full cross-section of professional disciplines is represented. Our staff includes lawyers, who directly assist chambers; linguists, who provide interpreter services in a wide variety of languages; computer technicians, who

support all aspects of court automation; architects, engineers, and mechanics, who plan, maintain, and support the Court's facilities; and other highly-skilled professionals. All Court staff, wherever assigned, work closely with other governmental agencies and participants in the criminal justice system to provide necessary support services for the prompt and efficient handling of court matters.

With the help of this diversely skilled work force, the Court processed 1560 new criminal case filings involving than 2484 criminal defendants, and 8996 civil case filings during 2010. The Southern District's caseload reflects not only the increasing population of South Florida, but also the diversity and uniqueness of the communities it serves. In addition to one of the most complex criminal caseloads in the country, the Southern District also has a unique mix of civil and international litigation stemming from its geographic location as a gateway to the Caribbean and South America. The Court's docket has also included internationally notorious criminal and civil cases with social and political overtones.

















Fiscal Year (Oct 1 - Sep 30)





Fiscal Year (Oct 1 - Sep 30)



Jury and Non-Jury Trials Completed Fiscal Year (Oct 1 - Sep 30)





Median Months Filing to Disposition Fiscal Year (Oct 1 - Sep 30)

Weighted Filings per Authorized Judgeship Fiscal Year (Oct 1 - Sep 30)





Priority Projects and Highlights

Case Management

CM / ECF

Electronic Case Files

CM/ECF

Computer Services installed a new high performance CM/ECF server and upgraded to CM/ECF version 4.0.2 in 2009. Since January, 2010, attorneys have been able to electronically file new civil cases. The benefits of electronic filing include 24/7 access for attorneys to file new civil cases; a reduction in the amount of paper filed in the Court; and a streamlined system in the assignment and transmission of cases to judicial officers.

PERFECT DOCKET PROGRAM

In 2009, the Clerk's Office adopted the lofty titled "Perfect Docket Program," with an eye towards improving the quality of our dockets. The program involves an aggressive training program for staff, with a goal of better consistency and quality of CM/ECF docket entries. Over 80% of our docketing is now done directly by attorneys over the Internet. Therefore, the Perfect Docket Program also includes outreach by sending CM/ECF trainers to law firms for on site training of groups of 20 or more, in hopes of improving the quality of attorney-generated docket entries.

ATTORNEY ADMISSIONS


Attorneys are required to pass a core exam in order to be admitted to practice in the Southern District of Florida. Previously, registering for the exam was a time consuming, paper intensive process. The paper exam was only administered four times a year.

As of November, 2009, attorneys have been able to register on-line for the exam and take a computer generated exam on site at the Miami, Fort Lauderdale and West Palm Beach Courthouses daily. According to recent survey results, attorneys have found the new attorney admissions process to be very efficient and appreciate finding out their results immediately.

Priority Projects and Highlights

GREEN TEAM

The Green Initiative started in 2009 as a grass roots effort originating from the interest of a few Court staff to reduce the amount of energy we use and non-recyclable trash we produce. Results of the Green Team have included the development of a paper recycle program for Court offices, recycled aluminum cans and plastic bottles in courthouse lobbies and break rooms, as well as setting up printers to print on both sides of paper to reduce the Court's paper consumption. Additionally, the Team provides interesting facts and benefits of recycling in an on-line newsletter for staff.




SCANNING PROJECT

The Clerk's Office's Records section, with the assistance of outsourced personnel, in 2009 began scanning more than 2.5 million pages of documents, dating back to 1972, that were stored in the basement of the Dyer Courthouse. The project involved a time-consuming process in which each page had to be carefully reviewed to ensure a perfect image of each document was scanned. The scanning project was completed at the end of 2010. The public can now review and copy thousands of old case records that were once inaccessible.

DIGITAL ACCESS RECORDERS

Throughout 2009 and 2010, digital recorders were installed in Magistrate Judge courtrooms throughout the District. Digital audio recordings, compared to the previous analog recording system, provides superior sound quality, longer record time, efficient storage, archiving of files, and allows access to any point in the recording instantly. Digital recorders are also PC compatible, therefore, the ability to download a file to the computer allows access to email capabilities, transcription kits and speech recognition systems.



Priority Projects and Highlights

CCAM: The Civil and Criminal Accounting Module (CCAM), a new, efficient case accounting and cash receipting system was installed by our Financial section beginning in the summer of 2010.

DOCUMENT RETENTION: In 2010, the Records section began reorganizing the management of paper throughout the Court by creating new records retention policies, clearing out and archiving old paper records and maintaining only the necessary amount of paper in accordance with retention policies.

TRIM EXPANSION: TRIM is an Electronic Data Management System and works as a repository for imaged documents, therefore allowing for easy retrieval of any document. TRIM was accepted as the Official Record for the Southern District of Florida in 2007 and is currently being used in Human Resources, Procurement and Budget, CJA and Financial. In 2010, TRIM was expanded to include the Executive Offices, Jury, Interpreters and Records sections.


PERFORMANCE MANAGEMENT SYSTEM: The Judicial Conference approved performance management guidelines for local implementation in 2010. Our Court developed a performance management plan that provides goals and timelines, priorities, communication and staff development. The plan provides for discretionary salary increases for exceptional performance and contributions to the Court. Staff training in performance management and evaluation systems began in February 2010 and the Court's performance management plan became effective with the first pay period in October, 2010.

NEW EXTERNAL COURT WEBSITE: The Court's website revamp project has been on the "back-burner" for years and finally this year, we rolled out our new external website. A team was formed to revamp the Court's website with a goal of making this site more professional, easier to use, and visually appealing. The new site was unveiled on October 23, 2010, and received high remarks from the Bar.

NEW CJA SYSTEM: A redesigned Criminal Justice Act (CJA) system was implemented in May 2010. The new system is a web-based program that provides faster access, better reporting capabilities, and improved accountability and navigational features. Our Court participated in the core group responsible for the development and implementation of this new system, and hosted system training for other courts. Also, we continue to participate in the CJA Core Project Team, evaluating system changes and future enhancements, and serving as a subject-matter expert.
