ASSIGNMENT OF CRIMINAL CASES PENDING  
BEFORE THE HONORABLE THOMAS E. SCOTT

In reference to Administrative Order 90-105, announcing the resignation of The Honorable Thomas E. Scott as a United States District Judge for the Southern District of Florida, effective October 31, 1990, and whereas there are currently 25 criminal cases pending trial and 9 criminal cases pending sentencing before Judge Scott, upon consideration, it is


ORDERED, ADJUDGED and DECREED that the Clerk of Court be and he is directed to reassign Judge Scott's criminal cases under our blind random filling system, utilizing a special criminal wheel created for this purpose, as follows:

-- The 25 criminal cases pending trial will be distributed amongst the 13 Southern District Judges presently receiving criminal case assignments, with each active Judge being assigned two cases, and Senior Judge Atkins receiving one case.

-- Nine judges will be randomly drawn from the wheel containing 13 judges' names to assign the criminal cases pending sentencing.

Further, the Clerk shall prepare such orders of reassignment as may be necessary to carry out this task.
