

It is hereby ORDERED AND ADJUDGED that:

- (1) Magistrate Judge Ann E. Vitunac will be assigned all of Judge James C. Paine and all of Judge Kenneth L. Ryskamp's civil and criminal referrals. Additionally, Magistrate Judge Ann E. Vitunac will cover Judge Daniel T. K. Hurley's ~~civil~~ referrals as well as cover some pretrial criminal matters for Fort Pierce irrespective of the assignment of the District Court Judge, but only in the event of a emergency where Magistrate Judge Frank J. Lynch is unavailable, or matters where Magistrate Judge Frank J. Lynch has recused himself.
- (2) Magistrate Judge Frank J. Lynch will be assigned all pretrial criminal matters in Fort Pierce and whatever civil matters are referred to him by the District Court Judges on the Fort Pierce assignment wheel. Additionally, Judge Frank J. Lynch will handle all of Judge Daniel T. K. Hurley's civil referrals.

In all other respects, Administrative Order No. 93-69 construing division of cases between Northern and Southern Division Judges and Magistrate Judges shall remain in full force and effect.
