At the request of the Court Security Committee, the Court has reexamined its current policy of disallowing cellular phones in the various buildings that comprise Federal Judicial Complex throughout the Southern District of Florida. After considerable debate on this issue, the Court finds that cellular phones shall be allowed in all Court facilities throughout the District for a period of ninety days. After said ninety days have passed, the Court will reexamine the security issues involved and issue a final order on this matter. The use of cellular phones *within the confines of all courtrooms will continue to be prohibited, and they shall be turned off at all times when inside courtrooms.*

The United States Marshal's Service is to inspect all cellular phones as they are brought into the building as directed to protect the Bench, Bar and Public from harm.
