

This Ad Hoc Committee shall work in conjunction with and under the supervision of the Standing Committee on Rules and Manuals. This Ad Hoc Committee is charged with reviewing the Attorney Admission standards of the United States District Court, Southern District of Florida, making recommendations to the Court with regard to training, trial experience, student practice and admissions examinations. It is also the purpose of this Ad Hoc

Committee to determine whether individual lawyers are failing to perform to an adequate level of competency necessary to protect the interests of their clients and to establish and administer a remedial program designed to raise the competence of a lawyer who is not performing adequately. Further, this Ad Hoc Committee shall review allegations of lawyer misconduct referred by the Court and to make reports and recommendations as to the actions the Court should take in relation to the Ad Hoc Committee's findings and recommendations. It is also the purpose of this Ad Hoc Committee to provide lawyers practicing before the United States District Court, Southern District of Florida with a means for voicing complaints and constructive suggestions concerning the administration of the Court. Comments, which are received in confidence by Committee members, are then discussed and reported to Judges for appropriate action.

This Ad Hoc Committee shall remain in existence until further Order of the Chief Judge. The terms of each member of this Ad Hoc Committee shall be for two (2) years from the date of this Administrative Order.




