

ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER 2003-112

IN RE: MODIFICATION OF MAGISTRATE
JUDGE PAIRING ASSIGNMENT PLAN
(Southern/Miami Division)



Administrative Order 2002-02 (amended by Administrative Order 2002-58) modified the Magistrate Judge pairing assignment plan for the Southern Division. The modifications effectuated by that Order are for a period of three years, commencing April 1, 2002, and expiring March 31, 2005, subject to the following amendments. It is hereby

ORDERED that, commencing November 6, 2003, Magistrate Judge Theodore Klein will be paired with District Judge Jose E. Martinez and Senior District Judge William M. Hoeverler. Magistrate Judge Klein will also be available for Multi-District Litigation (MDL) cases, for mediations, and for special master duties as may be referred by any District Court Judge in the Miami Division in his or her discretion and as an alternative to referral to the Judges' paired magistrate judges. It is further

ORDERED that, commencing November 6, 2003, Magistrate Judge Robert L. Dubé will be the assigned Magistrate Judge on all Social Security appeals assigned to Miami Judges.


In order to effect the orderly transfer of cases to Magistrate Judge Klein in accordance with the instant amendments, the following procedures shall apply:

As of the effective date of this order, the Magistrate Judges

formerly paired with Judges Martinez and Hoeverler (Magistrate Judges Dubé and Bandstra, respectively) shall retain until disposition all previously-referred, fully-briefed motions in cases assigned to District Judge Martinez or Senior Judge Hoeverler. In addition, both Magistrate Judges shall dispose of all other referred motions that become ripe for disposition in such cases until they have ruled on all fully briefed motions. Upon the Magistrate Judge's disposition of all fully briefed motions in any case assigned to Judges Martinez or Hoeverler, the Magistrate Judge shall certify to the assigned District Judge that he has ruled upon all such motions. Thereafter, District Judge Martinez or Senior Judge Hoeverler will issue an order directing the Clerk of Court to transfer the case to Magistrate Judge Klein. Any consent trial, consent motion for summary judgment, and other "consent motion" shall remain with the magistrate judge who was assigned to the case when the consent was given.

This Order vacates those portions of Administrative Order 2002-12 and 2002-58 with which it is inconsistent.
