


ORDERED that the following criminal cases will be transferred to the Honorable Paul C. Huck forthwith:

0:01CR6232, United States v. Spearman
0:03CR60046, United States v. Aguirre
1:03CR20216, United States v. Robinson

Magistrate Judge Barry S. Seltzer, the Magistrate Judge paired with Judge Roettger pursuant to Administrative Order 2002-12, shall rule on all pending referred criminal motions that are ripe as of the day the instant order is signed. Magistrate Judge Seltzer shall certify to Judge Huck that such motions have been ruled upon or that no motions were ripe as of the date of this order, and direct the Clerk of the Court to transfer the case to Magistrate Judge William C. Turnoff, who is paired with Judge Huck pursuant to Administrative Order 2002-02. The Clerk shall promptly execute the transfers to the new Magistrate Judge, and upon doing so shall immediately change the case's magistrate judge designation to Magistrate Judge Turnoff.

The Clerk's Office is directed to ensure that counsel of record in all transferred cases is noticed of the transfer via the Court's Faxback program.
