

AMENDMENT TO ADMINISTRATIVE
ORDER 2008-21 IN RE: SENIOR DISTRICT
JUDGE VOTING




On July 12, 2008, the Court entered Administrative Order 2008-21, incorporating the Court's vote on Senior Judges' eligibility to vote. The majority of the active District Judges voted to allow Senior District Judges who perform 50% of the work, in whatever fashion, to vote. The Administrative Order included a typographical error requiring six months of work within the last "six" month period rather than the correct language within the last "twelve" month period. Therefore, it is

ORDERED AND ADJUDGED that:

Pursuant to Section 503 of the Court Security Improvement Act of 2007, those Senior District Judges who have performed in the preceding twelve (12) month period an amount of work "equal to or greater than the amount of work an average judge in active service on that court would perform in 6 months" shall have full voting rights as to the appointment of court officers and Magistrate Judges, rulemaking, governance and administrative matters, in the United States District Court, Southern District of Florida.
