Civil & Criminal Distribution Fiscal Year 2018















Civil Cases Terminated Fiscal Year (Oct 1 - Sep 30)



Civil Cases Terminated by Trial




Progress at Termination Fiscal Year 2018 (Oct 1 - Sep 30)





Criminal Defendants Terminated Fiscal Year (Oct 1 - Sep 30)















Median Months Filing to Disposition

Fiscal Year 2018 (Oct 1 - Sep 30)




Disposition Time - Florida Southern







Case Filings Fiscal Year (Oct 1 - Sep 30)










Pro Se Case Filings Fiscal Year 2018 (Oct 1 - Sep 30)




Pro Se Case Filings Fiscal Year (Oct 1 - Sep 30)




