Instructions for Registration of Judgment from Another District Pursuant to 28 U.S.C.§ 1963

Please follow the procedures outlined below to 1. register an out-of-district judgment in the Southern District of Florida (SDFL) or 2. register a SDFL judgment in another district.

Register an Out-of-District Judgment in the SDFL:

- Obtain a completed <u>Clerk's Certification of a Judgment To Be Registered in Another District Form</u> (<u>Form AO-451</u>). The Administrative Office (AO) of the U.S. Courts has promulgated Form- 451 for use in registering judgments from district courts. The form must be completed by the Clerk's Office in the district where the judgment was entered.
- 2) Obtain a certified copy of the judgment from the originating district court. Contact the district court where the Judgment was entered or visit their website for current fees and obtaining the completed AO-451 form and a certified copy of the judgment to be registered in the SDFL.
- 3) **File** a **new Civil Case** using the **MC Case type** to submit the Registration of Foreign Judgment. An attorney who has CM/ECF access for SDFL must file the new case electronically. An attorney or a prose litigant who does not have access to SDFL CM/ECF must submit the following documents conventionally, in person or by mail, together with the filing fee payment to the Clerk's Office.

Required Documents:

- A signed **AO-451 form** and the **certified copy** of the **judgment** to be registered.
- A Civil Cover Sheet. Click here for the Civil Cover Sheet.
- The **filing fee** for registering a judgment from another district, pursuant to the current fee schedule. Click here for the <u>Schedule of Fees</u>.

Opening the **Case Electronically** in **CM/ECF**:

- The Case type should be **MC**.
- The Cause of Action is (regjgm) Registration of Foreign Judgment
- The Nature of Suit is 890.
- The Origin is 1 (Original Proceeding).

Register a <u>Southern District of Florida (SDFL) Judgment</u> in <u>Another</u> District:

- Obtain a completed <u>Clerk's Certification of a Judgment To Be Registered in Another</u> <u>District Form (Form AO-451)</u>. Please note that the filer is responsible for completing the top part of the AO 451 form (i.e., Caption, Party Names, and Case Number).
- 2) Submit the AO-451 form to the SDFL Clerk's Office. You can deliver the form in person to any of our court locations listed on the website https://www.flsd.uscourts.gov/court-info/court-locations. You may also mail it along with the payment for each certified copy of the judgment, as well as payment for the reproduction of any record or document, including fees per page, in accordance with the current fee schedule. - 3) Your AO-451 form will be returned to you with a certified copy of the judgment. **Submit** these **documents to** the **other district** where you want to register the judgment and contact the other court for the applicable procedures.

Note: The Clerk does not have the authority to issue a certification of judgment if any motion or appeal is pending that may alter or vacate the judgment.
