ORDER TO SHOW CAUSE

A certified copy of a judgment entered by the Supreme Court of the State of Florida, dated June 26, 1986, has been filed with this court. This Judgment states, in part:

"[W]e approve the recommendation of the referee, and disbar Respondent, effective 30 days from the filing of this Opinion."

Further, a certified copy of an Order entered by the Honorable Hubert R. Lindsey, Judge, Circuit Court of the Fifteenth Judicial Circuit, in and for Palm Beach County, has been filed with the court. It states, in part:

"Therefore, it is Ordered and Adjudged that Defendant Scott William Katz be disbarred. Further, it is Ordered and Adjudged that said disbarment shall be consecutive to that ordered in the Florida Bar vs. Scott William Katz, 11 FLW 90 (July 4, 1986)."


The Florida Supreme Court, via its Order dated August 13, 1986, affirmed Judge Lindsey's Order.

Therefore, pursuant to the Rules of Disciplinary Enforcement, United States District Court, Southern District of Florida, Rule 2(B), you are directed to file with this court, on or before

January 20, 1989, any grounds and reasons why the imposition of the identical discipline by this court would be unwarranted and the reasons therefore, pursuant to Subsection (D).

Therefore, if necessary, a hearing will be held before the judges of the United States District Court, in and for the Southern District of Florida or a committee or said judges appointed by the Chief Judge.
