Dear Judge King:

Thank you for taking time out of your schedule to meet with Charles Alliman and Joan Kendrall of my staff. Your willingness to assist us in planning and organizing the security arrangements relating to National Security Information (NSI) in U.S. v. Noriega, et al. is greatly appreciated.

As you have been informed by Mr. Alliman and Ms. Kendrall, special security arrangements are essential to protect the NSI that may be utilized in this litigation. In most Classified Information Procedures Act (CIPA) litigations, the Presiding Judge is required to review classified information for relevancy prior to other litigants having access. We would like to accommodate Judge Hoeveler by providing a Sensitive Compartmented Information Facility in his chambers to store classified materials. Mr. Alliman and Ms. Kendrall have discussed this with Judge Hoeveler and the Judge has agreed to allow adjustments to be made in a closet area in his chambers. Construction would be limited to replacing the existing door with a solid wood door, and installing locks and alarm devices. The cost of this procedure will be incurred by the Department of Justice. With your permission we would like to proceed as soon as possible.

I would also like to request that temporary office space be provided to Ms. Kendrall for the purpose of providing her with a sufficient work area for her duties as a Court Security Officer (CSO). This area would house a Secure Facsimile Machine and Secure Telephone, which will be provided by my office. An existing phone jack is all that is needed and would require no special installation. Mr. Henryk Montygierd-Lovba. Divisional Manager, Judicial Operations has suggested, with your permission, an office that is vacant in his area. This office is ideal as it is located in the Clerk's office which is not only convenient but critical to the CSO in the pre-trial stages due to the special filing procedures set forth by Court Order. Please be advised that these arrangements will be temporary until more permanent arrangements can be made.
