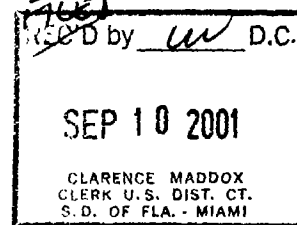

ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER 2001-43




**IN RE: BLANKET ORDER FOR DRAWING NAMES
FROM MASTER WHEELS FOR PETIT JURY SUMMONS**

The Court's practice has been to enter a separate order directing the Clerk to randomly draw a venire list of sufficient names of persons to be served summons for all panels occurring during the year. As a result, the Court enters 40-50 orders per year directing the selection of petit jury panels. To reduce the administrative burdens associated with entering separate orders for petit jury panels,

It is henceforth **ORDERED** that the Clerk shall regularly draw venire lists of names from the five divisional master jury wheels to be served summons by first-class mail to meet the Court's needs for venire panels for petit jury service without the requirement for any separate, individual order for each drawing from the master wheels. Such drawings shall be made in accordance with the Jury Selection and Service Act, 28 U.S.C. §1861, et. seq., with this District's Plan for the Random Selection of Grand and Petit Jurors, and with any Administrative Orders of this Court relative to jurors and jury selection.

It is further **ORDERED** that the Clerk and Jury Administrator shall conduct drawings with such frequency as necessary to meet the needs of this Court for jurors in upcoming trials as determined by the Judges of this Court.
