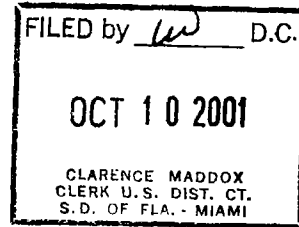

ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER 2001-47

IN RE: EMERGENCY WARRANT PROCEDURE  
FOR PRETRIAL SERVICES

It is hereby **ORDERED** that the following procedure shall be implemented regarding Emergency after hours warrant requests from Pretrial Services:

Upon a finding of the Pretrial Services' officer that a defendant is in an emergency situation<sup>1</sup>, the officer shall:


1. Verify the actual location of the defendant.
2. Call the U.S. Marshal's cellblock to advise that an emergency warrant will be requested.
3. Call the duty Magistrate Judge to request an emergency warrant and to make arrangements for the signing of the warrant.
4. Obtain the signature of the duty Magistrate Judge on the warrant.
5. Call the U.S. Marshal's cellblock to advise that a warrant has been signed and to arrange for delivery of the signed warrant.
6. If requested, the officer shall assist the U.S. Marshal in the identification of the defendant at the time of the arrest.
7. Contact the duty Assistant U.S. Attorney to advise of the defendant's arrest and, therefore,

<sup>1</sup>Emergency situation is defined as a situation when an officer is advised that the defendant is an imminent danger to himself or others, or the officer is advised that the defendant plans to flee the jurisdiction.

8. Prepare a violation memo to the court on the next business day.
