The Clerk shall promptly execute the transfers to the new Magistrate Judge, and upon doing so shall immediately change the case's magistrate judge designation to Magistrate Judge Turnoff.

The Clerk's Office is directed to ensure that counsel of record in all transferred cases is noticed of the transfer via the Court's Faxback program.
