ORDER OF SUSPENSION

The Supreme Court of Florida has suspended the above-named attorney from practicing law in Florida for a period of one year, following a June 3, 2010, order. *See The Florida Bar v. Vieth*, 38 So.3d 134 (Fla. 2010). That suspension was predicated on an uncontested report of the referee. The Clerk attempted to serve attorney Vieth by certified mail with an Order to Show Cause why this Court should not impose the same discipline, accompanied by the Supreme Court of Florida's Order of Suspension. Service at his court record address was signed for by his "agent" and service at his Florida Bar address was returned "Attempted - Not Known - Unable to Forward."

On August 30, 2010, attorney Vieth filed a Response to Order to Show Cause stating that it would not be unwarranted for this Court to impose identical discipline. Rule 5(d) of the Rules Governing Attorney Discipline, Local Rules of the United States District Court for the Southern District of Florida, provides in pertinent part that "[a]fter consideration of the response called for by the order [to show cause] . . . the Court may impose the identical discipline or may impose any other sanction the Court may deem appropriate." Given this background, pursuant to Rule 5(d) and the Court's inherent power to regulate membership in its bar for the protection of the public interest, *see Chambers v. NASCO, Inc.*, 501 U.S. 32, 43 (1991) ("[A] federal court has the power to control admission to its bar and to discipline attorneys who appear before it."),

IT IS ORDERED that said attorney be suspended from practice in this Court, effective immediately, for a period of one year. The Clerk of Court shall strike this attorney from the roll of

attorneys eligible to practice in the United States District Court for the Southern District of Florida, and shall also immediately revoke the attorney's CM/ECF password.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED by this Court that said attorney advise the Clerk of Court of all pending cases before this Court in which he is counsel or co-counsel of record.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED by this Court that the Clerk of Court attempt to serve by certified mail a copy of this Order of Suspension upon the attorney at his court record address.
