DMINISTRATIVE ORDER 2010-99

RECUSAL WHEELS

Numerous Administrative Orders have in the past established procedures for assignment of

matters when Magistrate Judges recuse themselves in cases, including Administrative Orders 2003-

111, 2007-06, 2007-42, 2009-50, and most recently 2010-79. Upon further review, the rules

established by these various Administrative Orders require simplification for ease of administration.

After consultation with the Judges of this Court and being otherwise advised of the premise set forth

herein, it is hereby

ORDERED that as of the date of this order, and until further notice, recusals by Magistrate

Judges of this Court, regardless of where a case is filed, shall be handled as follows:

Fort Lauderdale - Random and blind assignment to another Magistrate Judge from Fort

Lauderdale. If all Fort Lauderdale Magistrate Judges recuse, then random and blind assignment to

a Magistrate Judge from West Palm Beach. If all Fort Lauderdale and West Palm Beach Magistrate

Judges recuse, then random and blind assignment to a Magistrate Judge from Miami.

West Palm Beach – Random and blind assignment to another Magistrate Judge from West

Palm Beach. If all West Palm Beach Magistrate Judges recuse, then random and blind assignment

to a Magistrate Judge from Fort Lauderdale. If all Fort Lauderdale and West Palm Beach Magistrate

Judges recuse, then random and blind assignment to a Magistrate Judge from Miami.

Fort Pierce – Random and blind assignment to a Magistrate Judge from West Palm Beach.

If all West Palm Beach Magistrate Judges recuse, then random and blind assignment to a Magistrate

Judges recuse, then there will be a random and blind assignment to a Magistrate Judge from Fort

Lauderdale. If all Fort Lauderdale and West Palm Beach Magistrate Judges recuse, then there will

be a random and blind assignment to a Magistrate Judge from Miami. Due to geographic

considerations and for ease of administration, Magistrate Judge Lynch shall not be the recipient of

any recusal assignments from other Divisions unless all of the Magistrate Judges in the District have

recused and he sees no legal or ethical impediment in accepting such case.

Miami – All recusals by Miami Magistrate Judges shall be assigned to Magistrate Judge

Jonathan Goodman, unless Akerman Senterfitt is counsel of record. If that firm is counsel of record

or if Judge Goodman otherwise recuses, a random and blind assignment shall be made to another

Magistrate Judge from Miami. If all Miami Magistrate Judges recuse, then there will be a random

and blind assignment to a Magistrate Judge from Fort Lauderdale. If all Miami and Fort Lauderdale

Magistrate Judges recuse, then there will be a random and blind assignment to a Magistrate Judge

from West Palm Beach. Recalled Magistrate Judges shall not receive any recusal assignments and

shall not be included in any recusal wheels.

This Order vacates all previous Administrative Orders to the extent that they address recusal

procedures for Magistrate Judges, including but not limited to Administrative Orders 2003-11, 2007-

06, 2007-42, 2009-50, and 2010-79.
