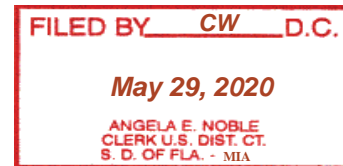

ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER 2020-36

**IN RE: GENERAL LOCAL RULE 88.3;
AMENDMENT TO COLLATERAL
FORFEITURE SCHEDULE**



Pursuant to a vote of the United States District Court Judges of the Southern District of Florida, it is hereby

ORDERED that Administrative Order 2017-37 establishing Southern District of Florida “Collateral Forfeiture Schedules” for the violations of regulations enforced by the Veteran’s Administration, Federal Protective Service, National Park Service, United States Fish and Wildlife Service, and United States Army Corps of Engineers, is hereby amended effective from the date of this Order to include the attached Forfeiture of Collateral Schedule for the U.S. Postal Service - Postal Police. The offenses specified therein shall be handled in accordance with Local Rule 88.3 of the Southern District of Florida in the same fashion as those schedules attached to Administrative Order 2017-37 (filed June 26, 2017).

Under the attached schedule, collateral may be posted in lieu of the personal appearance of an individual charged with certain covered offenses under the laws and regulations of the United States. The posting of such collateral shall signify that the person accused does not wish to appear nor request a hearing. Collateral so posted shall be forfeited to the United States and the proceeding shall be terminated. Collateral may not be posted for any covered offense if the alleged violator has been previously convicted of any such offense.

If a person charged with a covered offense for which collateral is required fails to post and forfeit collateral, any punishment, including fine, imprisonment, or probation may be imposed within the limits established by law upon a conviction by guilty plea or after trial. No person shall be detained for failure to post collateral for a covered offense for which collateral

may be posted unless the person is placed under arrest.

Nothing here shall prohibit a law enforcement officer from arresting an alleged violator for commission of any offense, including those for which collateral may be posted or mandatory appearance required, and forthwith notifying a United States Magistrate Judge for the purpose of appearance or setting bail.

Offenses for which collateral may be posted in lieu of appearance and the amounts of said collateral are shown on the schedule attached hereto. Said schedule, which covers regulations enforced by the U.S. Postal Service - Postal Police shall become effective upon the date of this Order and remain on file with the Clerk as a public record without the necessity for publication as part of the Local Rules.

232.1(c) Preservation of property.

Improper disposal of rubbish	\$200.00

Throwing of articles from a building or unauthorized climbing upon any part of a building	\$200.00
Willful destruction, damage or removal of Government property without authorization	\$500.00

232.1(d) Conformity with signs and directions.

Failure to comply with prohibitory or directive signs posted for safety purposes	\$100.00
Tampering with removal, marring, or destruction of posted signs	\$200.00
Entry into areas posted as closed to the public or others (trespass)	\$250.00
Failure to comply with directions of a Postal Police Officer	\$500.00

232.1(e) Disturbances.

Disorderly conduct which creates loud, boisterous, and unusual noise or which obstructs the normal use of entrances, exits, foyers, corridors, elevators, and stairways, or which leads to impede or prevent the normal operations of a service operation of the facility	\$250.00

Games for money or personal property, operation of gambling devices, lotteries, pools, and unauthorized selling of lottery tickets	\$200.00

Operation of a vehicle under the influence of alcoholic beverages or “controlled substance”	\$750.00
Entering postal premises under the influence of alcoholic beverages or “controlled substance”	\$250.00
Unauthorized introduction on postal premises of alcoholic beverages or “controlled substances”	\$250.00

232.1(i) Photographs for news, advertising, or commercial purposes.

Unauthorized photography on premises \$100.00

232.1(j) Dogs and other animals.

Animals on postal property other than those used to assist persons with disabilities \$100.00

232.1(k) Vehicular and pedestrian traffic.

Parking in no parking area lanes or crosswalks so marked, or in spaces reserved for physically disabled persons without valid placard \$150.00

Parking within an intersection or blocking a posted vehicle or posted exit lane sidewalk, Fire hydrant, walkway, or loading platform \$150.00

Parking in spaces posted as reserved or in excess of posted time \$50.00

Failing to come to complete stop at a STOP sign \$100.00

Operation of a vehicle in a reckless or unsafe manner, drag racing, riding over curbs, or leaving the roadways \$250.00

Exceeding posted speed limits \$150.00

Failure to yield right of way to other vehicles \$150.00

232.1(l) Weapons and explosives.

Possession of firearms carried either openly or concealed whether loaded or unloaded (except for official purposes) \$500.00

Introduction or possession of dangerous or deadly weapons or explosives (except for official purposes) \$500.00
