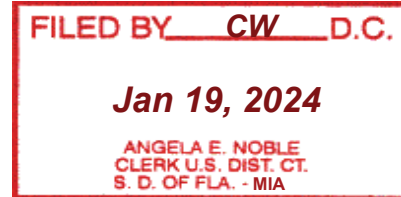

ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER 2024-10

IN RE: AMENDED RANDOM ASSIGNMENT
OF SOCIAL SECURITY CASES TO
UNITED STATES MAGISTRATE JUDGES



Pursuant to the authority conferred by 28 U.S.C. section 137, and to clarify Administrative Order 2023-18, issued to improve the efficiency and timely resolution of Social Security cases, it is hereby

ORDERED that all newly filed Social Security cases will be randomly assigned to Magistrate Judges (without paired District Judges) without regard to Division. Any party who objects to the assignment of a Magistrate Judge as the presider may opt out by filing a motion for case reassignment within the deadline given to the parties by the assigned Magistrate Judge. Upon receipt of an order granting the motion for reassignment, the Clerk will randomly reassign the case to a District Judge following the Court's standard civil case assignment procedures, keeping the original Magistrate Judge assigned to the case. It is further

ORDERED that the Clerk of Court shall begin randomly assigning all new Social Security cases in this manner on January 22, 2024, and until further order of the Court.
