ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER 91-21

**IN RE: CHANGE OF CRIMINAL  
CASE CATEGORY, 87-879-CR-ROETTGER  
U.S.A. V. KRAMER**

The case of U.S.A. v. Kramer was originally filed on November 25, 1987 as a Category V case. In 1990, Administrative Order 90-38, prepared in anticipation of the refilling of the Category V wheel, instructed the Clerk of Court to credit this case in Category IV, as it had not met the criteria of 61 or more days of trial.

However, the Clerk of Court was informed by Judge Norman C. Roettger that at that time he had not completed U.S.A. v. Kramer. Therefore, no credit was issued in category IV and the case remained in Category V.


On February 26, 1991, Judge Roettger notified the Clerk that he had completed the above-styled case and asked to be removed from the Category V wheel. His hours in court as reported on his JS-10's were as follows:

In order to receive credit for a Category V case, the case must have been tried for 61 days or more at an average of six hours per day. Thus, the above-styled case meets the requirements for a Category V case, and the Clerk of Court is directed to omit Judge Norman C. Roettger from the Category V wheel upon the refilling of the wheel.
