In light of the expiration of the 120 day appointment of Assistant United States Attorney James G. McAdams, III, on May 19, 1992, and President Bush's nomination to the United States Senate of Roberto Martinez, Esq. as United States Attorney for the Southern District of Florida,

IT IS ORDERED, effective 12:01 AM, Wednesday, May 20, 1992, pursuant to Title 28, United States Code §546(d), that Roberto Martinez, Esq., be and is hereby appointed as United States Attorney for the Southern District of Florida.
