

The Department of Justice having petitioned the District Court for an Administrative Order permitting government employee attorneys to appear on behalf of the United States without petition for admission and the court not having intended that they should be considered as outside the exemption for attorneys who are full-time Assistant United States Attorneys or Assistant Attorney Generals of the State of Florida, it is hereby

ORDERED AND ADJUDGED that Rule 4.F(2) of the Admission and Practice Rules be interpreted by the Clerk as authorizing any full-time lawyer for the Department of Justice appearing on behalf of the United States of America to appear and participate in particular actions or proceedings on behalf of his or her employer in his or her official capacity without individual petition for admission.
