
ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER 2014-57

**IN RE: ABOLISHMENT OF BANKRUPTCY
APPEALS CASE ASSIGNMENT WHEEL**

Pursuant to Administrative Order 2005-30, this Court established a pilot project for the creation of an assignment wheel comprised of a limited pool of three District Judges specifically to receive Bankruptcy Appeals, and that pilot was made permanent by Administrative Order 2008-27. Since its inception, the composition of Judges participating in the Bankruptcy Appeals wheel has periodically changed. *See* Administrative Order 2011-61. United States District Judge Robin S. Rosenbaum, now on the Circuit Court, participated in the Bankruptcy wheel. Judge Rosenbaum's confirmation now gives the Court the occasion to review the composition and continued efficacy of the Bankruptcy wheel. After consideration of relevant circumstances and after consultation with the Judges of this District, the Court has determined that the administration of justice at this time would be best served by returning to the purely random assignment of Bankruptcy Appeals that existed prior to the establishment of the pilot project for assignment of Bankruptcy Appeals. Accordingly, it is hereby

ORDERED that the Bankruptcy Appeals case assignment wheel is abolished effective immediately, and all Bankruptcy Appeals in the future will be randomly assigned among District Judges of this District.
